Launch of FIRST LEGO League Trinidad and Tobago

On Wednesday 23rd November 2016, NIHERST under the auspices of the Honourable Minister of Education, Mr. Anthony Garcia of the Ministry of Education, will launch *FIRST* LEGO League Trinidad and Tobago. A powerful programme aimed at engaging children in playful and meaningful learning while helping them discover the fun in science and technology, *FIRST* LEGO League has a presence in 80 countries. This country will be the first in the English speaking Caribbean to have such a programme. This initiative has been supported by Shell Trinidad Ltd., the official 2016 Cycle Social Investment Partner. Empowered by LEGO Education, the Trinidad and Tobago operational partner NIHERST will design, deliver and manage the programme for the 2016-2017 season, *Animal Allies*.

Geared toward participants of 9 to 16 years, the programme utilises theme-based challenges to engage children in research, problem solving, and engineering. The cornerstones of the programme are its Core Values, which emphasize contributions of others, friendly competition, learning, and community involvement. Working in teams of up to 10 children, and guided by at least two adult coaches, team members have approximately 10 weeks to:

- Build an autonomous robot that will, in two minutes and 30 seconds, complete predesigned missions
- Analyse, research, and invent a solution for a given assignment and present it
- Program a robot using LEGO MINDSTORMS, and then compete on a table-top playing field
- Present the Core Values of how the team worked in the 10 week journey

Over 180 young persons from over 21 teams are registered for the current cycle. The culmination of all the hard work by teams will be NIHERST's Preliminary Event in December 2016, followed by participation for ten shortlisted teams in the NIHERST/ *FIRST* LEGO League

Championship Event in March 2017. The final winning team will be flown to Houston, Texas for the World Festival in April 2017.
